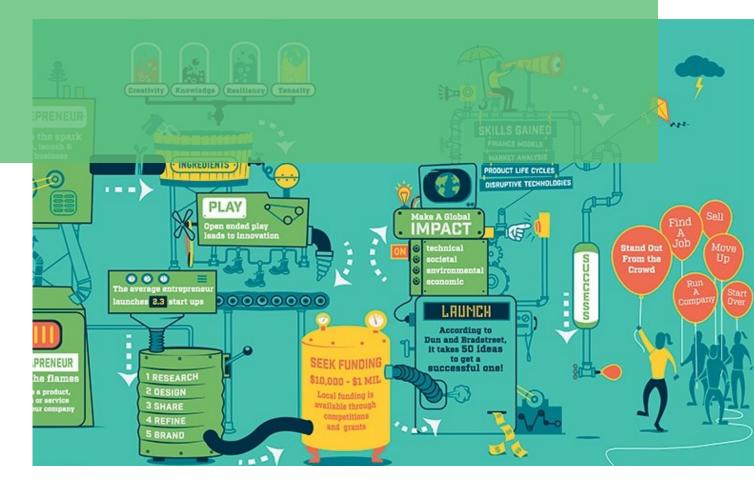

## Engineer's Tip

The best solutions come from problems you understand deeply.

□ Research how others are solving (or ignoring) this issue

□ Highlight what frustrates people most about current solutions

□ Narrow your focus to 1 clear, solvable problem

## STEP 2: Map It Like a System

Treat your business idea like an engineered system.

Define inputs: time, skills, software, materials

Design the process: what happens from lead to delivery?

Engineer's Tip

Great businesses flow like clean code — simple, repeatable, optimized.

Predi	ct the outputs:	value delivered,	transformation	achieved
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□ Sketch it like a circuit diagram (yes, literally)

## STEP 3: Prototype the Offer

Build a lean, testable version of your product or service.

]	Define the core result your offer promises
	Identify the absolute minimum needed to deliver that result
]	Create a first version — even if it's ugly
]	Get feedback from 3–5 real people (not just friends)

Don't wait to launch until it's perfect — launch so you can perfect it.

Engineer's Tip

The best entrepreneurs don't guess — they gather data and adjust.

## STEP 4: Test, Track & Tweak

Run experiments to validate, refine, and improve.

□ A/B test headlines, pricing, or delivery methods

□ Create a feedback loop (survey, email replies, 1:1 calls)

□ Track results: conversions, feedback, effort-to-output

□ Iterate — don't scrap, optimize

## STEP 5: Automate the Routine

Start building systems to scale your impact and reclaim your time.

Identify the tasks you repeat most often
Document the steps (SOP-style)
Use automation tools (Zapier, Airtable, Notion, etc.)
Delegate or schedule recurring workflows
